These figures are based on the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) estimate for the Fiscal Year 2021 Median Family Income of \$83,000 for the Lancaster Standard Metropolitan Statistical Area (SMSA). The SMSA and the area covered by Lancaster County are identical. As required by statute, the definition of "Very Low Income" is tied to 50 percent of the median income, and the definition of "Low Income" is tied to 80 percent of the median income for the area. Using the median income, a four-person family income limit is calculated and adjustments then made for other family sizes. The FY 2014 Consolidated Appropriations Act changed the definition of extremely low-income to be the greater of 30/50ths (60 percent) of the Section 8 very low-income limit or the poverty guideline as established by the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS),

provided that this amount is not greater than the Section 8 50% very low-income limit. Consequently, the extremely low income limits may equal the very low (50%) income limits.

Higher income limits apply to families with more than eight persons, although they are not shown because of space limitations. For each person in excess of eight, 8 percent of the four-person base should be added to the eightperson income limit (for example, the nine-person limit equals 140 percent of the relevant four-person income limit). All limits are rounded to the nearest \$50.
